**NARRATIVE**

Stolen Vehicle / Pursuit Supplement 17-6894  
Corporal James Stenger 3604

On 6/29/2017, I was working as the swing shift Acting Sergeant. I was wearing a full APD uniform and driving fully marked APD Vehicle VM1211. I checked my lights and siren prior to my shift and after this incident and found both to be working properly. This included a forward facing solid red light.

At about 0103 hours, I heard Officer Sahnic broadcast that he located an occupied stolen Mercedes Benz at the Chevron on A Street in Antioch (Contra Costa County). A short time later Officer Sahnic broadcast that the vehicle was fleeing from him northbound on A Street. At this time I was at the Fire Admin Building on W 4<sup>th</sup> Street. I started heading towards A Street.

Officer Sahnic broadcast that the vehicle turned westbound onto W 15<sup>th</sup> Street then northbound on C Street. I was on A Street near W 10<sup>th</sup> Street when Officer Sahnic broadcast that he believed the Mercedes was involved in a collision on C Street near W 9<sup>th</sup> Street. I responded to this area because I believed the suspect would most likely flee on foot if he was involved in a collision. When I got to C and W 9<sup>th</sup> Streets it was determined that the suspect did not actually crash but hit a dip and lost control of the vehicle momentarily. The Mercedes was lost in the downtown area for a short period of time.

I was on E and W 6<sup>th</sup> Streets when Officer Harger broadcast that the vehicle was now eastbound on W 6<sup>th</sup> Street. I watched as the Mercedes passed me travelling at about 60-65 mph in a 25 mph zone. I saw Officer Harger was several blocks behind the vehicle. I activated my overhead lights and siren and pulled behind the Mercedes and attempted to catch up with it. I watched as the vehicle travelled over A Street onto E 6<sup>th</sup> Street. I knew this road dead ended and there was no way for the Mercedes to exit the street.

I watched as the Mercedes stopped and a black male adult later identified as [REDACTED] exited the driver side door. I watched as [REDACTED] ran northbound and jumped a fence into a backyard. Officer Harger located [REDACTED] with his police K9 hiding underneath a vehicle on McElheny Road. [REDACTED] was taken into custody and I saw he was the same person that I saw fleeing from the driver side of the Mercedes.

I took no further action.
