NARRATIVE

Supplemental Report:

On 6-29-17 at about 01:00 hours I was working as a Police K9 handler for the City of Antioch. I was wearing a police BDU style uniform with a TacVest that clearly displays department patches sewn onto both shirt sleeves as well as a silver star badge over my left chest. I was driving a fully marked black and white patrol car #1204 with fully functional overhead emergency lights (including a solid red) and siren. I was partnered with my Police Service Dog - K9 Donna.

At this time I responded to the Chevron gas station located at 2413 A St, in order to assist Officer Sahnic who advised via police radio that he was attempting to stop an outstanding stolen vehicle (Silver Mercedes). I responded from 18th St and Cavallo Rd and arrived at the Chevron gas station in less than a minute.

As I pulled into the Chevron I could see the silver Mercedes was now pulling out of the gas station lot heading n/b on A St. As the Mercedes drove past me I could see the driver was a BMA wearing a white shirt and there did not appear to be anyone else inside the car that I was able to see. The Mercedes began to accelerate away rapidly with Officer Sahnic pursuing after it with his overhead emergency lights and siren activated.

I activated my emergency lights and siren and joined in the pursuit as a secondary unit directly behind Officer Sahnic. We pursued the stolen Mercedes n/b on A St. **(Refer to Officer Sahnic's report for specific details regarding the pursuit.)**

Eventually I lost sight of the Mercedes in the area of W 8th and E Streets. I began an area check for the vehicle and eventually relocated it in the area of W 6th St and F St. The Mercedes was now heading e/b on W 6th St from s/b G St and as I made a u-turn to pull in behind it the driver

accelerated rapidly away.

Cpl Stenger was able to pull directly behind the Mercedes on W 6th St and again I was in the #2 position about a block behind Cpl Stenger.

As the Mercedes continued e/b onto E 6th St from A St the vehicle stopped across from 43 E 6th and a BMA wearing a white shirt and dark pants exited the Mercedes from the driver's door and ran northbound across E 6th St eventually jumping residential fences and entering the residential backyards.

I decided to utilize my PSD based on the following:

-1. Probable cause existed to arrest the vehicles driver for VC10851(a), stolen vehicle and VC 2800.2, evading - both felonies

-2. The stolen cars driver was committing a misdemeanor by fleeing from the vehicle on foot and running/ hiding from the police - PC 148(a)(1)

-3. The driver was actively resisting by fleeing from the police

-4. The driver had not yet been searched and could possibly have been armed; thereby a potential threat of violence or serious harm existed to the public, any officer, or the K9 handler.

-5. The driver had fled on foot into a residential neighborhood and was now running through residential backyards, where if he was not immediately apprehended, he would pose a threat to the safety of the local residents as well as any officers searching for them. There are typically numerous tools and other objects that could be used as improvised weapons found in residential backyards and these weapons could be used against the officer's conducting their searches.

-6. It was nighttime and dark out, there were numerous trees, bushes, buildings, sheds, carports and parked vehicles to hide in, behind, or underneath that could allow the suspects to lay in wait for officers searching for them or to elude capture all together.

I began an on leash area search with my K9 near E 6th St and McElhany Rd. As I walked down McElheny Rd from E 6th St I yelled out a clear and loud K9 deployment announcement stating the following:

-A police K9 was going to be used to search the area.

-If the dog finds anyone they could be bitten by the dog.

-If anyone was hiding in the area give up or surrender now they would not be injured.

With nobody in the area making their presence known or surrendering the K9 began searching the area and almost immediately began to alert to the presence of human odor along the east side of 51 E 6th St along McElheny Rd.

Within a couple minutes the K9 located and engaged the SUS hiding underneath a parked white Mercedes within a covered carport area along the east side of 51 E 6th St. The SUS was lying on the ground and had completely concealed himself from view under the car near the rear tires and trunk area. With the K9 actively engaging the male I began to order him out from underneath the car. The male did not appear to be coming out willingly and the K9 had to physically pull him from underneath the parked car. Once the male was pulled out from under the car by the K9 I could see the K9 had a bite hold of the males right shoulder area.

Cpl Stenger assisted in getting the male into handcuffs at which time I immediately removed the K9 from the bite. I estimated the duration of the K9 apprehension to be about 20-30 seconds. The SUS was later identified as **ARR-** [REDACTED]

As a result of the K9 apprehension, **ARR-** [REDACTED] had minor punctures and lacerations to his right and left shoulder areas as well as his face and both ears. **ARR** [REDACTED] also had a minor abrasion to his left shin but it was not caused by the K9 apprehension and was most likely caused as he was running from yard to yard and jumping fences.

AMR was immediately called to the scene to treat **ARR-** [REDACTED] injuries. **ARR** [REDACTED] was taken to SDMH to be treated.

At SDMH I took several digital photographs of **ARR** [REDACTED] injuries and later attached the photos to this case file.
